

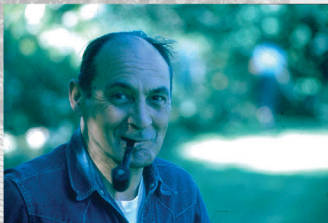

Conservation and Literature



Roderick Haig-Brown

Born in Sussex, England in 1908, Roderick Haig-Brown was tutored formally in the English tradition of clear thinking and elegant writing, and informally in the tradition of passionate and intelligent fly-fishing. He spent three years on the West Coast beginning in 1926, including time in Seattle where, in a bookstore, he met "a really charming girl called Ann Elmore."

Returning to the West Coast permanently in 1931, Roderick married Ann. They settled on the banks of the Campbell River in a house which they named "Above Tide." For nearly sixty years, the house and the 20 surrounding acres were the centre of the Haig-Browns' life, a life devoted to writing, fishing, raising a family, serving the community, and developing the ideas and practice of conservation.

The Haig-Browns were motivated by a conservationist ethic before conservation and environmentalism were popular. They

were both serious gardeners. The property today reflects the care and attention with which the Haig-Browns treated their land.

Roderick fought hard against the damming of the Campbell and Fraser Rivers with mixed results. Also, he served on the International Pacific Salmon Fisheries Commission which regulated the catch of salmon from the Fraser River stocks. Widely read by experts and generalists in his own time, Roderick believed in indigenous Canadian literature before its modern expression.

Ann, whose intellectual contributions to Roderick's work were immeasurable, typed every manuscript and also served as editor and consultant. In 1960 she began work as the librarian at Campbell River High School. She was very active in the Catholic Church and other community organizations.

Their ethic is clearly demonstrated in Measure of the Year, Roderick's almanac of life on the Campbell, published in 1950. This book contains vivid evocations of the annual natural cycle on the property.

It is the two themes of intelligent conservation and indigenous literature that the Institute seeks to preserve as the Haig-Brown legacy.



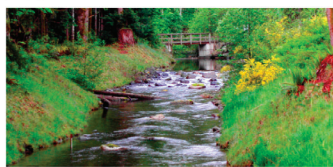

The Institute is continuing the work begun by the Haig-Brown Kingfisher Creek Society which, in fulfillment of Haig-Brown's dream, rebuilt the creek running through the property. Now, the Institute is the steward of the Campbell River watershed. Current projects include building two fishways on the Quinsam River, promoting conservation among youth and adults, and speaking out on relevant issues regarding the river.

The work is locally based and largely volunteer. Its inspiration is Haig-Brown's vision of people adopting and caring for a stream.

In order to fulfill the goal of Roderick and Ann Haig-Brown that their house "be used by deserving writers and conservationists," a writer-in-residence program has been established. Each winter, a Canadian writer of note, supported by the Canada Council, lives and writes in the Haig-Brown House. As well, the resident supports local writers by listening to their work and making editorial suggestions.

The Conservationist's Concern

from Measure of the Year, 1950

I have been, all my life, what is known as a conservationist. I am not at all sure that this has done myself or anyone else any good, but I am quite sure that no intelligent man, least of all a countryman, has any alternative.

It seems clear beyond possibility of argument that any generation of men can have only a lease, not ownership, of the earth; and that one essential term of the lease is that the earth be handed on to the next generation with unimpaired potentialities. This is the conservationist's concern.

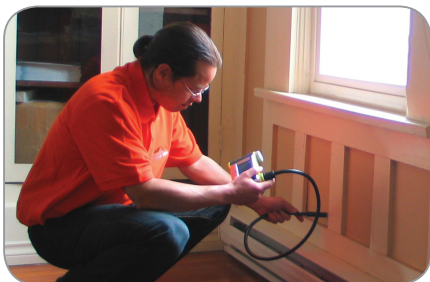

Things you should know

1. British Columbians live in an active earthquake region.
2. A major earthquake is predicted within the next 25 years.
3. To survive an earthquake your home must be securely bolted to its foundation.
4. Most homes built prior to 1978 are not bolted to their foundations.
5. Many homes built after 1978 are improperly secured to their foundations and will not withstand earthquakes.
6. When your home is shaken from its foundation major damage, injury and loss of life may occur.
7. Your house, property and family can be protected from the catastrophic effect of an earthquake for as little as \$2,750 by bolting your house to its foundation.
8. Even if you purchase earthquake insurance, for a cost of approximately \$3,000.00 per year you will likely be responsible for the first \$100,000.00 or more of repair cost and losses.
9. Quake Safe bolting methods are shown to minimize earthquake damage and loss.

What are the advantages of retrofitting?

Retrofitting your home maximizes the safety and survival of your family during an earthquake. Without it, collapsing roofs and structures can cause injury or death and trap occupants inside. Collapsed homes are at risk of gas leaks, smoke and fire.



Retrofitting your home will cost FAR less than the cost to repair damages to your home after an earthquake.

Most homes shaken off their foundations are usually not repairable and must be demolished. A case study of two identical homes during a San Francisco earthquake showed the one retrofitted incurred \$6,000.00 of damage and was livable during the repairs while the non-retrofitted home collapsed and cost more than \$200,000.00 to rebuild.

Earthquake insurance does not protect your family during the earthquake, can result in deductibles of up to 40% of the re-construction costs and may not include temporary housing while your home is rebuilt.
